

The National Conservation Foundation (NCF) is a sister organization of the National Association of Conservation Districts. Every year, NACD hosts an auction during the NACD Annual Meeting to benefit the National Conservation Foundation. The NCF's Virtual Auction is a great opportunity to support conservation while gaining exposure to potential customers or clients! All proceeds from the auction support important programs and all funds raised will go toward building the next generation of locally-led conservation leaders through NCF programs such as the NCF-Envirothon, NACD Stewardship and Education Program and Next Generation Leadership Institute (NGLI). Each year, the international NCF-Envirothon Competition hosts over 25,000 high school students across the United States, Canada and China as they embark on a journey to learn and test their knowledge of natural resources. At the NCF-Envirothon, teams are evaluated on their performance at each of the following training/testing stations: Soils/Land Use, Aquatic Ecology, Forestry, Wildlife, and a Current Environmental Issue.

Education is a critical element of the conservation effort at the local, state and national levels. The longstanding NACD Stewardship and Education Program provides conservation districts and their partners opportunities

to educate younger generations, particularly grades K-8, on various natural resources topics. Educating young people about the benefits of conservation helps to ensure the next generation will be wise stewards of America's natural resources.

The Next Generation Leadership Institute (NGLI) is ready to take conservation leaders to the next level by training individuals to rise to the challenge of understanding and directing national, collaborative efforts in locally-led conservation. Participants will become national leaders of tomorrow through personal, civic and organizational leadership development in order to meet the future needs of natural resources management, as well as increase their capacity to navigate and manage complex current and future conservation challenges at the national level that impact conservation districts across the United States.







## 2021 SUMMER CONSERVATION FORUM AND TOUR

On July 25, 1946, at the Statler Hotel in Chicago, Illinois, 18 representatives from 17 states created the National Association of Soil Conservation

District Governing Officials. In 1970, during the annual convention in San Francisco, the association's name was shortened to the National Association of Conservation Districts (NACD).

As part of our 75th Anniversary celebration, the 2021 NACD Summer Conservation Forum and Tour is returning to where our association was born in Chicago!

As the second-largest NACD event of the year, the gathering brings together hundreds of conservation district leaders from across the nation, including tribal representatives and representatives from the U.S. territorie

representatives and representatives from the U.S. territories. The agenda includes a full NACD board meeting, a conservation forum plenary session, concurrent sessions on conservation and conservation district-focused topics and a set of conservation-minded tours. This is a national meeting with a regional flair that offers a first-hand look at how conservation is delivered, while also providing direct access to our top leaders.

#### Butte SWCD, Idaho Recycling Agricultural Chemical Containers

Butte Soil and Water Conservation
District (BSWCD)'s Recycling Agricultural
Chemical Containers program allowed

reducing plastics in the waste stream.

#### Sierra SWCD, New Mexico Conservation Days

Sierra Soil and Water Conservation District planned for Conservation Days. The intent was to hold a conservation days summer camp open to 6th-8th grade students.

Due to the pandemic, they instead sent educational activities home to students, including information on growing mushrooms, aquaponics tanks, raising butterflies and more.
